

Dear COB friends: Once again a new issue of the Corvettes of Buffalo newsletter. Notice my "new look" cover. Your opinion? Your car of the month photo could be there! Fall has arrived though and with it, fewer events where we actually are driving our "favorite cars", but the joys of the holiday seasons are always welcome. Sadly, we also must see to storing those cars for the winter months ahead and there are always "tips". For the C8, I am told that maintaining the gas tank at 25% or less is a good idea, plus I always run the tire pressure up from 30 to 40psi to avoid flat spots. I like to put 2x10 or 2x12 pcs. of wood under the tires to add space under the car and lift it for better air circulation. In an emergency it could be rolled off them. For a concrete floor I add pieces of cardboard (flattened clean old boxes) underneath to absorb any moisture (It's my own idea!). I plug the exhausts, but put a note on the steering wheel about it. The garage is heated somewhat. I like to cover the cars after making sure they are somewhat clean. I do envy those people that have a color "C8R Corvette Race car" cover, but at over \$1000, it's a hard sell. My stretch one was well under \$100.

NCM Motorsports Park to Become Nation's First Commercialized Track with Z06 Fleet Today, the NCM Motorsports Park (MSP) announced the expansion of its vehicle fleet with the introduction of two Z06 Corvettes, making the MSP the first and only commercialized track in the nation to offer consumer facing-driving experiences in the much-anticipated new Corvette model. MSP will allow guests to experience the power and performance of this amazing vehicle, by driving four (4) laps (above highway speeds) in a lead/follow format around the 3.2-mile, 23-turn road course. Guests can also purchase a Fast Pack which will add a Zero to Sixty launch on the straightaway and a Hot Lap driven by an MSP professional. This add-on is designed to showcase the car's performance capabilities in a safe and fun environment. The Z06s will boast a V8 engine with roughly 670 horsepower and a redline of 8600 rpm, sure to bring excitement to all sports car fans. "We pride ourselves on delivering world-class experiences to our guests," says Greg Waldon, Executive Director of the NCM Motorsports Park. "By adding the Z06s to our fleet, we're taking our



services to the next level. Being the first track in the nation to offer this kind of experience is special, and we look forward to thrilling Corvette enthusiasts and car lovers from across the country."

The MSP's new Z06s will be built later this month and will be available to the public later in the fall for Touring Laps. In the meantime, fans can help design the Corvette wrap by selecting which Z06 will receive a custom-designed Mobil 1 wrap. They will also have a chance to vote on the wraps theme and select the final design. The contest will be open to the public and voting will take place on the MSP social media channels starting later this month.

The NCM Motorsports Park has started a waiting list for guest interested in booking Z06 Touring Laps, which can be accessed on the webpage at motorsportspark.org. Visitors can currently enjoy C8 Corvette driving experiences, track rentals for personal vehicle driving and racing, and high-speed go-karts. The Motorsports Park also offers group karting as well as corporate and private events.

ELECTION PROCEDURES

Article Thirteen: Elections:

- 1. The attendance record for the year's meeting/activities in lieu of meetings will be recorded in the September newsletter for all members eligible to be nominated for any officer or Board position.
- 2. Election procedures will be published in the August newsletter for member review.
- 3. The election process for officers and board members is as follows:
- a.) September Business Meeting Nominations for office. Those members named will have the opportunity to either accept or decline each position to which they have been nominated.
- b.) October Business Meeting Nominations may be reopened by a majority vote of the members in attendance as long as the person(s) to be nominated is (are) present at this meeting. Those members named will have the opportunity to either accept or decline each position to which they have been nominated, after which nominations are closed. Individuals nominated in September and not able to appear at the October business meeting must arrange to submit their decision, in writing, to the President. If this notification is not received prior to the October meeting, the member's name will be removed from the ballot. Those "accepting" are to submit an article, to be published in the November newsletter, outlining their qualifications, accomplishments, goals, etc. for the particular office, which they desire to hold.
- c.) **November Business Meeting** Elections by written, secret ballot. Names of members running for, but not elected to the office of president will automatically be placed on the ballot for vice president, if he/she desires. Additionally, the names of members running for vice-president, but not elected to the office of Vice-President will automatically be placed on the ballot for Board of Directors, if he/she desires.
- d.) **Proxy vote** a vote by proxy must be submitted to an officer or Board of Director member in order to be recognized. The vote must be received in a sealed envelope.






This past year I had the pleasure of working with Barb Lipome in organizing the very successful summer picnic. I have committed to working on the picnic next year as well.



The C8 Makes it Great!

It all started out with 2 free nights at a Choice Hotel in Carlisle. We had never been to Carlisle before, so we took advantage of the free hotel offer to take our beautiful C8 for a little ride. The itinerary steadily grew into an 11 night sojourn from Hershey, Pa to Orlando via Carlisle. We were amazed how much "stuff" our C8 could hold! We are heavy packers and had plenty of room for essentials and more.

We have fond memories of past car events in Hershey, so a stop at Chocolate World was in order. A MUST DO in Hershey World is the Chocolate Milk Shake, and Yuengling Porter Ale made with Hershey Chocolate.

Then on to Pottsville Pa. to the nation's oldest brewery, Yuengling! The 55 minute trip was perfect for the C8—rolling hills and a slightly curving highway on a sunny day was just what the C8 ordered. The Yuengling tour was historic, entertaining and informative and concluded with a taste of 2 Beers! (BTW Both Hershey World and the Yuengling Brewery tours are completely FREE!! and within an hour's ride from Carlisle.)

Bright and early Thursday morning, we arrived at Carlisle Fairgrounds. We parked in the NCCC Corral by 8:30 am and soon ran into fellow COBers Pastores and Hubers. We walked all the way back to the Swap Meet, which was not an interest to us because we have a newer car, but everything else was interesting. George loved all the exhibits and Corvette vendors. We stayed for both Corvette Seminars at the Chevrolet Tent. They included a Q & A and discussions with Jeff Strausser, Brand Quality Manager for Corvette and Dave Simpson the Corvette Transmission Manager, who also has a Matrix with Tension Blue interior C8. Also at the event were Skip P, Jim K, the Horans and Woodleys. (Kevin Horan even won a prize at Carlisle for his car! And he was also featured on Rick Conte's You Tube Channel!) After lunch, shopping and a drink(s) at the Tiki hut, we finally returned to the car at 4:30 pm. A FULL day! We loved Carlisle, despite the oppressive heat, and have already secured reservations for next year.

Upon exiting Middlesex Diner in Carlisle, we were surprised to see a dozen fellow Corvette owners surrounding our car. They were in love with the Ceramic Matrix Grey Metallic exterior with Tension Blue interior combination. One owner even commented she ordered the exact same car a week ago and was expecting delivery in 6 weeks. (?) It's so great to watch people turning heads to look at the car. So many people make comments like "Love the car—Beautiful car—Great car — Cool car." It's not very hard to get used to. We quickly realized we needed to allow an extra 5 or 10 minutes in parking lots to answer questions and accept congratulations and praise.

After a quick stop in Lexington North Carolina, we spent the night in Darien Georgia to have dinner at one of our favorite restaurants, B&J Steak and Seafood. Our journey back to Lake View began at 4:30 am on Friday morning. We drove 12 hours to Summersville, West Virginia, our usual stop. The car ran perfectly and we were comfortable and cool the entire trip. What a difference from our much loved C5 Z06! The mountain scenery provided a perfect background for some pictures. We arrived safely home Saturday afternoon, rested, refreshed and secure in the knowledge that the C8 was a great car for an extended trip. And all the "fragiles" arrived home in perfect order.

- -There's always room for an extra pair of shoes.











