#### Cinnamon Cream Cheese Rollups

1 Jumbo Loaf of Sandwich Bread (couple of days old) - Cut off crusts and then roll flat with rolling pin.

Make filling with following ingredients:
1 pound cream cheese softened
3/4 cup of sugar
2 egg yolks
1 teaspoon vanilla

In mixer beat ingredients until creamy and then set aside. Melt 1 cup of butter and set aside. Mix 1 cup sugar with1 teaspoon cinnamon.

Spread filling on flattened bread and roll like a jelly roll.

Dip each rolled bread in melted butter and then in the sugar/cinnamon mixture.

Place on cookie sheet overnight or freezer for 1 hour.



#### **Article Thirteen: Elections:**

- The attendance record for the year's meeting/activities in lieu of meetings will be recorded in the September newsletter for all members eligible to be nominated for any officer or Board position.
- 2. Election procedures will be published in the August newsletter for member review.
- 3. The election process for officers and board members is as follows:
- a.) September Business Meeting Nominations for office. Those members named will have the opportunity to either accept or decline each position to which they have been nominated.
- b.) October Business Meeting Nominations may be reopened by a majority vote of the members in attendance as long as the person(s) to be nominated is (are) present at this meeting. Those members named will have the opportunity to either accept or decline each position to which they have been nominated, after which nominations are closed. Individuals nominated in September and not able to appear at the October business meeting must arrange to submit their decision, in writing, to the President. If this notification is not received prior to the October meeting, the member's name will be removed from the ballot. Those "accepting" are to submit an article, to be published in the November newsletter, outlining their qualifications, accomplishments, goals, etc. for the particular office, which they desire to hold.
- c.) November Business Meeting Elections by written, secret ballot. Names of members running for, but not elected to the office of president will automatically be placed on the ballot for vice president, if he/she desires. Additionally, the names of members running for vice-president, but not elected to the office of Vice-President will automatically be placed on the ballot for Board of Directors, if he/she desires.
- d.) **Proxy vote** a vote by proxy must be submitted to an officer or Board of Director member in order to be recognized. The vote must be received in a sealed envelope.

Sun, Jul 31, 2022 at 5:35 PM Hi peter, thanks for the pic of the 72 in the old shade of blue. I didn't have that one in the folder, it looks to have been in pretty reasonable shape for being stood for 20 years and a pretty straight car. Still figuring out the vacuum system. Ever since the car arrived here, the wiper door and headlamps have opened when the engine is started and then close again after several seconds. I thought this was normal and was a test to show the system was operating correctly. Reading through a few posts on vette forums it seems this may not be how things are supposed to work. What is your understanding of whether this is correct or not. Some say a possible fault in a control valve under the wiper door vent grill or a leaking check valve, (the little silver one near the plastic filter) a friend said he put jubilee clips on all the vac hose connections and it improved the performance over when they were just a push on fit. I will keep reading for now.

July 31st,2022 6:50pm: Gary That vacuum system could be a problem for even export vette shop here. I replaced and rebuilt just about everything in that system. I also found that some of the new parts were defected like a new headlight switch I replaced. Check the vacuum tank under the front driver fender because they leak. They expand, contract, develop cracks, and leak. Wish I could help you more on it!

Gas here, for high test is going down to under \$5 after being over \$6.00 last month. It is still expensive, but we still go for Ride's to club events and car meets just about every day. Weather has been very hot (in 90s) but it cools down at night when the sun goes down. The virus seams to under control with Americans getting mild form, but they aren't going to hospital or dying. Prices of everything are going up, but we are going OK even though being retired!

What happening over there? I hear it get even hotter across the pond. Check the 2 corvette newsletters to see what we are doing.
